SHAHRP is a classroom based program almed at reducing alcohol-related harm and risky consumption. It is designed to be implemented at a time when prevalence data indicates that young people are starting to experiment with alcohol. The SHAHRP activities incorporate various strategies for interaction inducing delivery of utility information; skill rehearasi. Individual and small group decision making; and discussions based on scenarios suggested by students, with an emphasis on identifying alcohol-related harm and strategies to reduce harm. Interactive involvement is emphasised, with two-thirds of activities being primarily interactive and another 15% requiring some interaction between students.

The SHAHRP program was developed with students and teachers and reflects the life experiences of young people, while also fitting well within the school curriculum. The program is culturally adaptable and behavioural results have been replicated in Northern ireland and in Brazil providing strong proof of evidence.

Benefits

- Delays and reduces the rate of growth in alcohol use
- Reduces binge-drinking and alcohol-related harms
- Increases alcohol knowledge
- Creates safer alcohol-related attitudes.
